#### Assessment systems

#### Types of Assessment

Assessment of this course is ruled under the *Normativa de Evaluación de Titulaciones Oficiales de Grado y Máster de la Universidad de Extremadura* (DOE 212, 3 Noviembre 2020).

This course offers two types of assessments:

- Ongoing assessment.
- Global assessment.

The student will be able to choose at the beginning of the course, through the online Campus, whether he/she wishes to be assessed through ongoing assessment, or at the end of the course through the global assessment. In case he/she does not choose any option during the approved period for that matter, it will be assumed that the student is choosing the ongoing assessment.

#### **Ongoing assessment**

This type of assessment consists of different activities distributed throughout the semester:

- Final written Exam (30%).
- Ongoing assessment (70%). Individual or group work. Class attendance and active participation in the classroom. Activities for ongoing assessment won't be recoverable.

In extraordinary exams, the ongoing assessment will count for 50% of the mark, and the rest 50% will correspond to the theoretical part.

### Global assessment

There will be an alternative final exam of global character, that will allow passing the

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course by means of passing this exam. The exam will mean 100% of the mark (10 out of 10) and will consist of a theoretical part (50%) and a practical part (50%).

### Assessment criteria

- 1. Correct writing and speaking, adapted to the journalistic language.
- 2. Agile, clear and adapted written and spoken language.
- 3. Scientific rigor and depth in content.
- 4. It will result in a failing grade:
- a. Whenever there is a breach of the basic journalistic ethical rules, such as those of the Federation of Press Associations of Spain's *Código Deontológico de la profesión periodística*.
- b. Any type of fraudulent performance, falsifying of information, copy or impersonation. It is not allowed the use of any materials without consent or license, nor class notes, work from other students, or work that has been already turned in to different courses.
